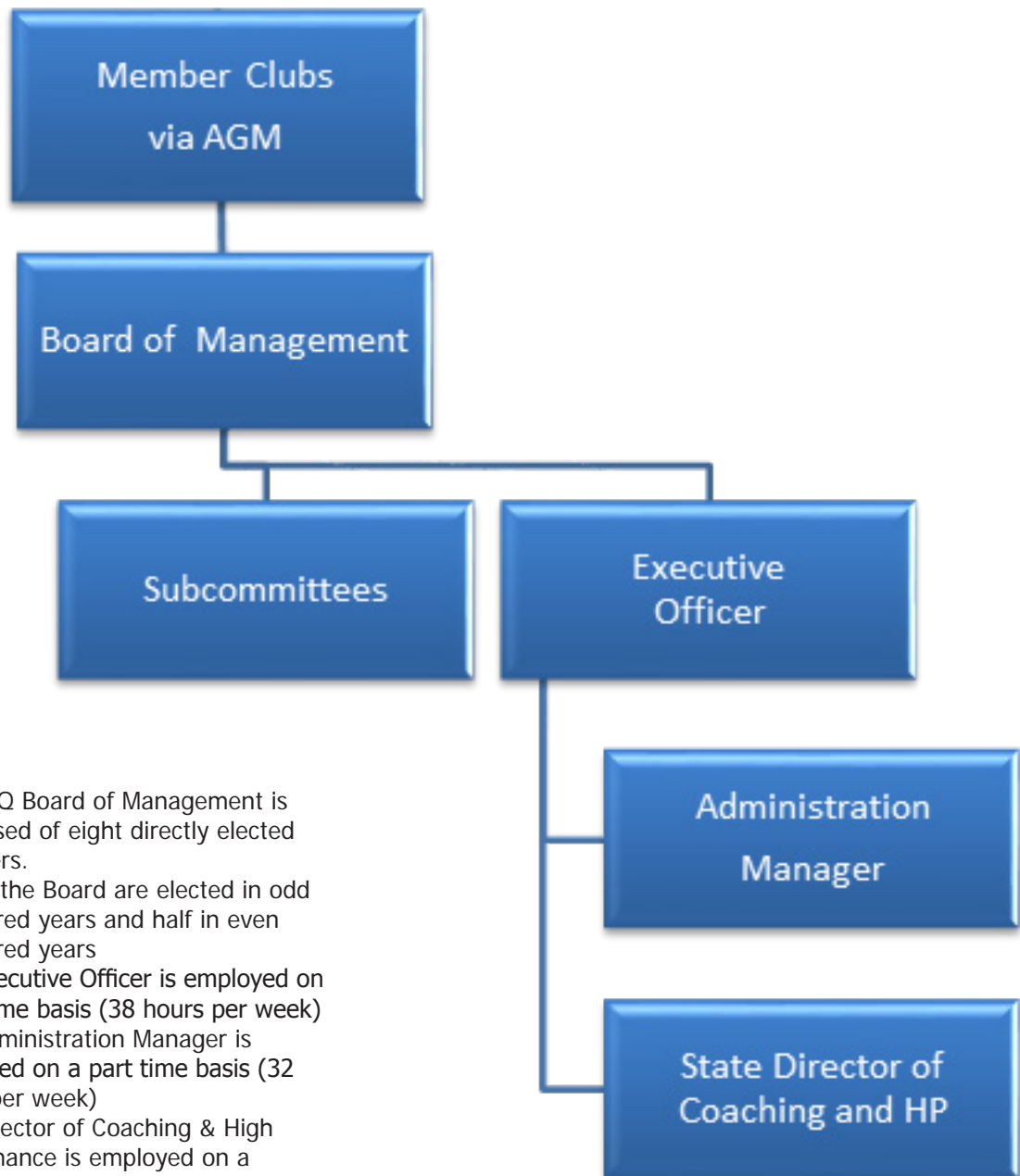

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Trevor Barrett

This annual report represents a summary of various activities involving Table Tennis Queensland, its individual members and member associations during 2015. The detailed reports in the following pages outline the numerous aspects of our organisation including membership growth, financial status, governance and successes in table tennis at various levels, both within and beyond Queensland. I am pleased to commend this report to the clubs and associations and trust that the information in the subsequent pages will enable members to see that Table Tennis Queensland is a financially healthy and active organisation aiming to meet the needs of its members.

At the outset, I would like to formally acknowledge the contributions of our CEO (Jason Walsh) and Administrator (Karen Carruthers) during 2015. As I have said previously, the role of the Board is to determine policy, but unless the implementation of that policy is successfully driven, we will make little progress. Both Jason and Karen have contributed significantly to Table Tennis Queensland during 2015, and they frequently go beyond the bounds of their employment to ensure the success of our undertakings as an organisation.

The up-coming AGM sees the completion, as part of our succession planning, of the two year terms of several Board members, including Joe Clifton (Rockhampton), Danny Lloyd (Brisbane), Steve Mitchell (Toowoomba) and Katrina Forster (Townsville). On behalf of the membership of Table Tennis Queensland I would like to thank those retiring Board members for their contributions over the past two years and look forward to your continued association with table tennis in Queensland. In particular I would like to acknowledge the efforts over many years of Katrina Forster who will not be seeking re-election at the AGM, and we also congratulate Katrina on her appointment as a Board Member

for Table Tennis Australia. I have little doubt that Katrina will continue to make a positive contribution to Australian table tennis in her new role.

In terms of membership, 2015 saw our overall numbers of registered players reaching 1710, this being a slight increase from the 2014 total of 1644 members. Within our member associations we have seen both increases and decreases in membership, no doubt for a variety of reasons within each association. To those associations whose membership has waned, or remained at its previous level, can I urge you to again review your approaches to securing new memberships, and renew your efforts in 2016. Our membership remains predominantly male and veteran player in nature, but it is pleasing to see female players comprising about 25% of our overall membership, and hopefully this will continue to grow. With Junior membership at about 17% and Seniors at 10% of our total, there is also obviously a continuing need for all clubs to make increased efforts in these areas.

The year 2015 provided many aspects of innovation and change for Table Tennis Queensland, and I would like to highlight some specific aspects of our activities, and offer some broad discussion on the reasoning behind these developments. To this end I will draw on some information that was provided in a recent article in *Over the Net* as it does, I feel, provide a good overview of our activities.

One significant outcome in 2015 was that we were able to send a squad of junior players to the Pacific School Games in Adelaide, where table tennis featured as an exhibition sport for the first time, and hopefully table tennis will be included as a sport at the PSG in future. Our squad of players was part of a 650 strong team across various sports from Queensland, and the juniors had the opportunity to play against high standard players from every other state of Australia as well as China, Macau,



India and Cambodia. Participation at the games was the culmination of many years of effort in trying to develop table tennis within the school arena in Queensland. A consequence of TTQ's undertaking in these areas, is that table tennis is now being trialled as a recognised Queensland School Sport. This is a significant milestone in our development but a requirement of our continuing recognition as a school sport is the on-going development of table tennis in schools across the state. While TTQ can drive this undertaking, increased participation at school level can only happen if the clubs in each local area take the initiative, and we need all clubs to be prepared to be part of this process. More players in your local schools means potentially more members in your club, and all clubs need to be aiming for increasing the numbers of Junior players if our sport is to continue to grow.

Our other major undertaking in the latter part of the year was of course the staging of the 2015 San-Ei Australian Veterans Championships in Caloundra. This event was the largest Australian Veterans ever held, attracting a record 480 players from across Australia and abroad (New Zealand, USA, England, Japan, Germany and Slovakia).

While this event is discussed in more detail in the Executive Officer's Report, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the organising committee and the members of the Sunshine Coast Association who made an outstanding effort during the week. The Australian Veterans event also welcomed major Sponsors San-Ei and Table Tennis World, and TTQ is working to maintain and further develop our relationships with both of these partners as well as other potential sponsors for the future. The event was described by many as "the best ever" and once again showed that Queensland is capable of staging major table tennis events.

Beyond the Australian Veterans we also hosted various other successful major tournaments along with numerous local Association Open events across the state. We have also seen the continuing development of Women's events along with emerging Veteran's tournaments in different locations around Queensland, and due credit must be given to the organising committees and volunteers from the various associations stepping forward to host and promote these events. The role of volunteers continues to underpin the success of our sport and I urge all clubs to continue to recognise the contributions of your members, both within your own association and by nominating members for TTQ Volunteer Awards.

2015 also saw a significant change to the Selection Policy in terms of our reverting to the participation in Queensland state level closed events as being mandatory for players to be eligible for selection in Queensland teams. As with any significant change of this nature there has been some concern by some of our membership, but these changes have occurred with a long term aim to re-establish our state level closed events as "marquee events" for table tennis in Queensland. This is a primary goal to which the Board of TTQ is working, and for this to occur we need participation in these events to be viewed by our players at all levels as the pinnacle of state level participation each year. It is only if all of our best players participate at such events that we can bring back to these events the status that they once held, and equally importantly, we can only expect major sponsors such as those mentioned above to be attracted to, and supportive of table tennis in this state if we can offer such high standard tournaments for sponsorship. I urge all players to continue to support these events in future because by doing so, you will be assisting with the development of our sport and improving the standard of table tennis across the state.



A further major achievement in 2015, was the acceptance by the Honourable Leanne Donaldson, Minister for Agriculture and Fisheries, of the role of Patron of table tennis in Queensland. Leanne is a former table tennis player herself, who readily accepted the role of Patron, and has been prominent in her attendance at various events during the year. We thank Leanne for her continuing support of our sport.

The latter part of 2015 also saw the trialling of a new ranking system for players, being an initiative primarily of Board members Danny Lloyd and Steve Mitchell, and I would like to thank them for their considerable efforts in the development of this system. The aim of the new system is to put in place a quantifiable and transparent process based on participation in Queensland events to determine the Queensland Rankings in various age groups each year. There will also be a minimum level of participation to be eligible for a Queensland ranking from 2016 onwards, an initiative which is again designed to promote participation in Queensland events by Queensland players. There will no doubt be some teething issues with the new system, but the Board is confident that in the long-term, this system will be of significant benefit to table tennis in Queensland.

We are pleased to welcome Patrick Wuertz as our new State Director of Coaching and High Performance, and I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the TTQ Board to thank Cathy Townsend for her efforts in this role in recent years. Patrick has a high performance background in table tennis in Germany, and is looking forward to his new role in Queensland. We also are pleased to welcome our new State Development Officer Greg Fox, who comes to us through funding from Table Tennis Australia, as part of a further nation-wide initiative to develop table tennis as a sport in the Australian school system. This is a very significant initiative from TTA, focussing on primary school children, and I

urge all clubs to support Greg in his role.

In the area of player achievements, 2015 again saw many successes for Queensland players. While these are outlined in more detail later in the Annual Report, I would like to make mention of a few notable performances from some of our Junior players, because at the end of it all, they are the future of table tennis in this state. Early in 2015 the National Junior and Cadet Top 10 Tournaments were held at Seagulls Table Tennis Club. This is a major event in the Juniors calendar and it was pleasing to see Mateo Dvorani and Rebekah Stanley win the Cadet Singles events.

At the Australian Juniors in 2015 our Under 18 Boys team (Mateo Dvorani, Benjamin Gould, Olav Dahl and Rayden Smith) were successful in winning the Silver Medal. Also, in the Under 13 Girls event our team (Meena Bakenay, Tahnee Green, Rebecca Tran and Leah Scott) were successful in taking out the Bronze Medal.

Another rapidly developing area in Queensland table tennis is in the AWD category. A team of six players represented Queensland at the 2015 Australian Para Table Tennis Championships. Larissa Brown (nee Daveson) made her debut at this competition, being given a Class 10 classification, joining Andrea McDonnell, Joel Coughlan, Jackson Meyn, Kate Juillerat and Ashley Parrott to form a small but formidable team that achieved some outstanding results for themselves and Queensland. I encourage all clubs to recognise these achievements and embrace the development of Junior and AWD table tennis in your organisations.

Financially, as you will read in the Treasurer's Report, Table Tennis Queensland is in a sound position, finishing the year "in the black" with an increase in overall equity on the previous year. Given the number of major undertakings of TTQ each year we are, as a not-for-profit organisation, making steady progress. In areas



such as support of our representative teams, support and development of our coaches, umpires and officials in terms of funding and professional development courses, in our governance and our ability to host major events, we continue to be a leader among states in Australian table tennis. We are supported in these undertakings and gratefully recognise the on-going financial support of the Queensland Government through the Department of National Parks, Sport and Racing. On behalf of all members of TTQ, I would also like to express sincere thanks to our EO (Jason Walsh), Administrator (Karen Carruthers), Treasurer (Joe Clifton) and other members of the Board of TTQ, for your efforts in the management of our financial affairs during 2015.

To conclude, on behalf of the Board, I would like to thank all members of Table Tennis Queensland for your contributions to our sport during the past year, and wish you all a successful and productive year in table tennis in 2016.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Jason Walsh

INTRODUCTION

After the busiest year in my time with Table Tennis Queensland (TTQ), I'm pleased to provide a detailed report on an action packed 2015. A number of key developments in the school participation area were of note. Along with successfully coordinating the largest National Championships ever in Australia, we also welcomed a couple of new personnel to the TTQ team. As per every year given the resources that we have, we would not be able to achieve many parts of our operations without the support of our associations and volunteers across Queensland.

PARTICIPATION

Membership figures for 2015 showed an increase on the previous year from 1644 to 1710. The Sunnybank Table Tennis Club has been a great new addition to our affiliated clubs. With 46 members in the first year of affiliation is a great result for the club. The Bundaberg club also saw a rise in membership on the back of their fantastic development program in place. A detailed breakdown on all clubs' membership is available on page 20 of the annual report.

Club membership decreased by one affiliation to 24, with the Table Tennis Academy Townsville & Maclagan Memorial Hall Table Tennis Association not affiliating. We welcomed the addition of the Sunnybank club to TTQ.

The Queensland schools events were a major development in 2015. The announcement that Tennis Table would be a sport featured at the Pacific School Games (PSG) in Adelaide, presented a fantastic opportunity to develop the events.

We began working with Queensland School Sport (QSS) in late 2014 to develop a pathway to select a QLD Schools Table Tennis team for the first time. This meant we had to expand on the number of regional events coordinated, include a state final and an Athletes with a Disability (AWD) event. The fact this is the first time we

have worked directly with Education Queensland meant we had to get it right so that we could begin the process to get Table Tennis recognised as an official sport by the QSS department.

Working closely with our clubs and volunteers we expanded the number of regional events from 4 to 6. This included Brisbane, Gold Coast, Toowoomba, Cairns, Mackay & Bundaberg. The first ever state final was then held in Brisbane the day prior to the QLD Junior Championships to assist those that participated in both events. The state final was a great success with over 75% of the players that qualified attending.

We also coordinated the inaugural QLD Athletes with a Disability (AWD) Schools Championships at the Gold Coast in 2015. This event was to assist with the selection of AWD School teams to represent QLD at the PSG event. But it was also a fantastic development towards increasing the opportunities for AWD students to participate in table tennis. We had 24 students compete with all students enjoying the event. With the success of the state final and AWD event, they will both be part of our annual calendar and we will strive to continue to grow these events.

A total of 16 students represented Queensland at the Pacific School Games event in Adelaide, along with three team staff members. We will now continue to work with Queensland School Sport to expand on our Schools events across the state and strive for table tennis to be officially recognised.

The State Championships were fully coordinated by Table Tennis Queensland for the third year in a row. A lot of positive feedback has been received on how TTQ coordinated these events. We would like to thank the referees and volunteers that assisted with the Championships. Also, thank you to the players for their continued support of all Queensland State Championships every year.

DEVELOPMENT

In 2015 we welcomed Patrick Wuertz as the new State Director of Coaching and High Performance. He brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the role and will be a valuable addition to TTQ for years to come.

Table Tennis Australia were successful in attaining an increase in federal funding, which all states around Australia received benefit. TTA have employed development officers in all states to implement the new Australian Sports Commission initiative 'Sporting Schools'. Greg Fox was appointed the State Development Officer for Queensland in late 2015. TTQ would like to acknowledge and thank TTA for this fantastic opportunity.

TTQ developed a relationship with James Cook University (JCU) in 2015, through their Student Placement program. We were lucky enough to welcome Katie MacDonald to the team whilst she completed a 100 hour internship. Katie is studying Events Management and the timing of the Australian Veterans Championships at Caloundra couldn't have been better. This event was the focus of Katie's workload and she did an amazing job, going above expectations on many occasions. We will continue to work with JCU to offer students similar opportunities in the future.



TTQ secured our first major sponsor in some time through a partnership with San-Ei and Table Tennis World. San-Ei were the major sponsors of the Australian Veterans Championships at Caloundra. We were fortunate enough to have San-Ei President, Mr Shin Miura, present at the event. We have begun working on continuing to develop our partnership and have San-Ei onboard long term.

A special mention to the Moreton Bay Table Tennis Association, who officially opened their new home at the Centenary Lakes Sports Complex in Caboolture. The club has developed a range of new participation options for their members.

In 2015 our newsletter 'Over the Net' changed frequency, from 3 to 9 editions annually. Positive feedback has been received from our members regarding the change. We will strive to keep our members more informed throughout 2016.

EVENTS

TTQ in conjunction with the Sunshine Coast Table Tennis Club, coordinated the 2015 San-Ei Australian Veterans Championships at the Caloundra Indoor Stadium from 17-24 October. Work had begun almost three years prior thanks to the efforts of Paul Green, Ken Hay & Tony Herbert in the early stages.

As we slowly got closer to the event the anticipated number of entries continued to grow, which added considerably to the workload of everyone involved. In total, 480 competitors played at the event, which was the largest ever National Table Tennis Championships held in Australia.

The event would not have been possible without the support of the amazing volunteers of the Sunshine Coast club. Also Paul Green, Ken Hay, Lukas Kozak & Katie MacDonald all put a considerable amount of effort into the event. Bev and Brian James our tournament controllers, along with our great officiating team ensured the event ran exactly to plan. When Ken Cole, Chairman of the TTA Veterans Committee reflected on the event he said it was

the 'best ever' Australian Veterans held, which is a testament to the time and effort everyone involved had contributed.

GOVERNANCE

The 2015 Annual General Meeting (AGM) brought about some changes to the TTQ Board of Management with Lionel Rose elected to the Southern Board Member position and Tony Herbert retiring from the Board of Management. I'd like to thank Tony for his support over the last few years.




AUDIT REPORT

DIRECTOR OF COACHING AND HP REPORT

Patrick Wuertz

In September 2015 I took over the role as the Director of Coaching and High Performance. Coming originally from Germany, I have been involved in Table Tennis for over 15 years as a player, coach and manager. In 2008, I began working for the largest state table tennis federation in Germany, developing and implementing training concepts, for high performance players. Partly due to my study area of exercise science and health promotion I became more involved in the education of coaches. It is exciting to work with passionate coaches and players in Queensland on both the development of the high performance and the participation program.

2015 has seen major changes in both the coaching team and the coaching education programme. A new Coaching Education Program rolled out by TTA, new selection criteria on state and national level and a new Director of Coaching and High Performance are just some examples.

Coaching Education

Over 25 coaches attended the Tops and Level 1 Coaching Courses in Brisbane and Mackay. The Level 1 coaching course in Mackay was the last ACTM Course under the old coaching framework. In December Table Tennis Australia commenced the roll-out a new coaching course framework, which includes the update of the course content for the Level 1 and Level 2 coaching course and amendments for the prerequisites. A new requirement for participants who want to obtain their Level 1 accreditation is an existing Tops course accreditation. In 2016, there are at least two Level 1 Coaching courses and one Level 2 Coaching Course planned in Queensland.

I was pleased to see the way in which clubs were seeking for development opportunities for their coaches. More clubs, schools and even health organisations seem to encourage their members to join the coaching courses. Certainly, the growth of our coaching workforce will contribute significantly to a better quality coaching support to the athletes and participants.

Training

Over the past few years an increasing number of players showed commitment and dedication towards their training. The result is not just an increasing number of players seeking for private and group coaching in the clubs, but also in junior players who travel interstate and overseas for training. Examples in Queensland were Jake Duffy (Sweden), Rebekah Stanley, Olav Dahl (both South Korea), Matilda Alexanderson, Benjamin Gould (Melbourne) and Ben Houghton (Austria).

Over the last year TTQ provided state training camps in Brisbane and Cairns to provide training opportunities equally distributed over Queensland. However, in 2016 TTQ is aiming to provide further training opportunities, particularly for those players who are likely to represent the state on national and international level.

OFFICIATING REPORT

Dave Delpratt

The year was a very busy one for various tournament organisers and officials with several major events being conducted in Queensland and at Tweed Heads as well as the introduction of separate Queensland Schools Table Tennis Championships for both able-bodied players and athletes with a disability. All of these events, plus the usual calendar of regional and State tournaments provided many opportunities for the further development and experience of all personnel concerned. Unfortunately, apart from locally conducted courses, no umpire or referee courses were held during the year.

Congratulations go to Will Almasi who was named as the 2014 Fran Keyhoe TTA Official of the Year, this award being announced after last year's report. He continued to be highly involved in virtually every major event held in Queensland and at Tweed Heads during 2015, trained to present umpire courses and subsequently ran two Association courses. Another to be congratulated is Kenneth Wong who completed all the requirements of the State Referee course. He very capably refereed the Queensland Junior Championships in Brisbane, along with Lukas Kozak, as well as several club Open Championships.

Numerous Queensland umpires gained valuable experience at the ITTF World Junior Circuit Australian Junior and Cadet Open and later the ITTF World Tour Australian Open, both of which were held at Tweed Heads, and at the Australian Veterans Championships later in the year at Caloundra. Jared Stanley travelled to Kiribati to umpire at the Oceania Junior Championships, his first international trip as an umpire.

Internationally, Dave Delpratt was the referee for several tournaments both in Australia (Tweed Heads, Bendigo, Adelaide) and in Oceania (Kiribati, Papua New Guinea), along with Joe Clifton, as Deputy Referee at the Australian Veterans at Caloundra.

The continuing use of Tweed Heads for major Australian and international tournaments provides Queensland umpires with the opportunity to obtain regular exposure to the higher standards of presentation and competition. As many of them will likely be involved at the 2018 Commonwealth Games, it is important they continue to accrue this experience. It is pleasing to note that three have nominated to sit for the 2016 International Umpire exam. The need to train and develop more umpires and referees within Queensland, especially younger ones, continues to be a concern as it is unrealistic to expect the current officials to continually make themselves available.

It is in their own best interest for Associations to either conduct courses (Association, State, National Umpire; State Referee) or assist members to attend courses held elsewhere. Funding is available from both the State Government and Table Tennis Queensland.
